- VIII. Presentation - Wolverine Pipe Line Company's 650 plus miles of underground steel pipeline is located in Cook County. A PowerPoint presentation detailing Wolverine's history, pipeline operations, regulations, safety, accident prevention, right-of-ways, emergency response preparation and other topics is being delivered

today. A Wolverine management representative conducts every presentation and will be available to answer any questions.

IX. TIER II Update

- We have 29 active facilities that haven't submitted 2016 Tier II reports. Most are 2015s that didn't report for 2016.
- If the facilities don't comply by the end of April, we will make them inactive due to non-compliance.

Federal EPCRA was amended to align with the Global Harmonizing System (GHS) and will now have additional Physical and Health Hazards Categories on safety data sheets, thus changing the Tier II requirements. The amendment goes into effect on January 1, 2018. We'll go from the 5 current categories (fire, pressure, reactive, acute, chronic) to 24 categories. I've attached a copy of what the Tier II Manager Chemical Description Screen will probably look like after we update the system as well as an OSHA document explaining the 16 sections of the new SDS requirement. There is a plan to have the Tier II vendor update the system in April so facilities will have time to submit 2017 Tier II update reports before the 2017 annual Tier II reporting year begins on January 1, 2018.
